


WONDERFUL WORLD BOOK DAY AT HILL TOP

EYFS – Mathematic Development



In Nursery children have

developed their understanding in maths this term. They have been working up to five focusing on: how numbers look, their order and collections of items to match.

Their favourite game is hide & seek with a stick of five Unifix - one child hides some behind their back & the other uses their maths skills to figure out how many they are hiding. Great practise for number bonds to five!

KS1 - A Cake fit for our Queen

KS2 – Reading into writing

In Year 3/4 children have been immersed in the mystery core text 'Edie and the box of Flits'.

KS2 – Egyptian Excellence in History



In Year 3 children have loved learning like historians to find out about the Ancient Egyptian civilisation, they're knowledge about this period in history is amazing. They are very proud of their published writing linked to the core text 'Egyptian Cinderella'.





They have published their own stories adding mystery to intrigue the reader!

KS2- The Tudors

In Year 5/6 the children have completed a Design and Technology project to create a Tudor house using woodwork equipment and real saws!

They have published character descriptions of Henry VIII and diary accounts as if they were Sir Walter Raleigh using the core text 'My Friend Walter'. The children are so proud that they can now use parenthesis, active and passive verbs and a range of modal verbs when writing.

KS2 – Cross Curricular

Year 6 amazing outcomes after studying the remarkable artist Tim Jeffs and pulling all their learning together around the core text 'Holes'.

Our History strand has been – **Power , Leadership and Invasion.'** Children have been answering the enquiry question 'Who were the Tudors?' Look how they explained their own understanding of the Battle of Bosworth and this was just the beginning...



We Love Reading! - World Book Day at SDLA

Children and staff across our academy loved making their favourite characters and listening to author Michael Rosen as part of the day. Our children are striving to build their love and confidence in reading and each week we celebrate in our assembly reading and learning at home. Some of our pupils have been to Friday's book shop swap 5 times with 250 reads already!





'I wonder what will wash up on the beach'

The children within Foundation Stage have had a brilliant start to their new topic 'I wonder what will wash up on the beach'. They enjoyed a themed day where they learnt to walk the plank, dig for gold and dance like an octopus! The children within reception have enjoyed studying a wide range of sea creatures and put their knowledge into practise by writing sea creature fact files.





Key Stage 1

This half term Year 1 have really enjoyed learning about superheroes. They have particularly enjoyed becoming a superhero for the local community. The children have created posters asking people not to litter and how to recycle that will be going up around the local area soon.

Year 2 visited 'The Deep' in Hull as part of their learning for our topic 'Commotion in the Ocean'. The children had the opportunity to observe animals first hand and up close such as stingrays, yellow dog-faced pufferfish and best of all the penguins.

Lower Key Stage 2

In Year 3 our learning this term has been focused around the Vikings. We have been exploring how to use water colours to create a seascape. To create our final pieces, we investigated using sketching pencils for different techniques. This included hatching, cross hatching, circling, stippling and scribbling. Here is a selection of our seascapes.

In Year 4 this term, we have been studying train travel in Doncaster. This has included finding out about the history of the railways in our town, the current geographical issues around the cancellation of HS2 and building our own model locomotives in DT.

After experimenting with electrical circuits in our Science work, we have put our machines to the test by seeing how powerful we could make them.

Upper Key Stage 2

In Year 5, we have really been enjoying our Space topic this term. During Science week, we celebrated Mars Day (Monday 14th March) which involved us being involved with a series of talks, through the power of Microsoft Teams, with the UK Space Agency. This term, in Year 6 we attended Crucial Crew. We took part in a range of workshops based on fire safety, road safety and first aid. Our favourite workshop was the court scene, where we were able to have different roles as magistrates, solicitors or the offender of a crime.

Athletic Achievements

Carr Lodge Athletics Team blew us away with their performance in the South Yorkshire School Games Final on Friday 18th March. They made it through tough qualifying rounds to be one of the top two schools in Doncaster to make it to the final. They were brilliant and we are so proud that they came 2nd place in the whole of South Yorkshire.
