Great Accomplishments at Sheep Dip

Our Reception children achieved 72% at Good Level of Development, National average was 67% which shows strong progress since starting our academy across Early Years.

In KS1 SATS, we achieved 79% in our Phonics Screening Check, which is equal to National averages, with a total of 87% by the end of Year 2.

We achieved 67% in Reading for KS1 SATS with 68% being the National average. We achieved 67% in Writing for KS1 SATS with 60% being the National average.

We achieved 73% in Maths for KS1 SATS with 71% being the National average.

Reading, writing and maths combined was 67% National being 56%.

We achieved Gold Sports Mark – moving from our previous
Bronze Award showing our commitment to sport at our academy.



We achieved 80% in Reading for **KS2 SATS** with National averages being 73%. Grammar, punctuation and spelling was 86% with National being 72%.

We achieved 77% in Writing for KS2 SATS with National averages being 72%.

We achieved 89% in Maths for KS2 SATS with National averages being 73%.

Reading, writing and maths combined was 71% with National being 59%.



We achieved 21.8 as an average score in the Year 4 computerised Times table check with the national average score being 20.4. 46% of pupils achieved 25/25. We are so proud of our pupils mental maths knowledge!

We have won 2 FFT National Attendance
Awards across 2 terms for Autumn and
Spring. Our academy attendance for the year
is 93.7% with 92.5% being the National
average.
